have low self-confidence. I decided to enter this competition to show them that you can achieve anything if you put your mind to it and believe in yourself. It's really important for me to make everyone feel like a somebody."

Giuliana Fenwick is a complementary therapist who works with people with special needs. Her appeal worked, and Ollie was saved from suicide when he received an inspirational postcard from Mr Morpurgo, telling him to 'read, write, and be you'. The postcard was his solace whenever he faced difficult times. Having now achieved his dream of studying Creative Writing at Bath Spa University, the power of words has been proven for Ollie. Giuliana and Ollie have recently been telling their story across radio and in the national press and are delighted that Ollie's condition is getting more recognition and understanding. Giuliana is continuing to work with young people who face similar complex conditions.
